Delivery is normally during the last week in April. For tree planting needs, the conservation districts usually have a list of available groups or contractors.

Aspen

Aspen forests provide some of the best habitat for deer and grouse, especially during its younger years. For this reason, many forest owners are now harvesting aspen that was first harvested back in the 1960's and early 1970's.

At 30-35 years of age, aspen generally outgrows its prime habitat benefit for deer and grouse; but at this age it is also merchantable for a harvest.
